

SIGNS of a HEALTHY CHURCH

Let's look at these one by one to help you out.



Methods of ministry change all the time.

Some churches have an impact on young adults, and some reach senior adults. Some use events to reach the community, and some focus purely on Sunday morning worship. Some meet in church buildings, and some churches meet in homes. But there's one thing they all need to have in common: everything must be centered on the Word of God.

The Bible is the foundation of our faith. Every sermon, every teaching, and every class must be driven by Scripture. When looking for a healthy church, make sure their beliefs come from the Bible.

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,

Jesus is the only way to salvation.

Because of Jesus' great love for us, He lived a life of obedience on our behalf, took the punishment for our sins on Himself, and died on the cross. But three days later, having defeated death, Jesus rose from the dead. If we repent of our sins and trust in Jesus as our Lord and Savior, we are forgiven our sins.

But it doesn't stop there. We cannot be content to merely call Jesus "Lord" and then move on with our lives. We must live and act in response to Jesus' Lordship. Unfortunately, churches sometimes forget that we are commanded to share the Good News and make disciples of Jesus Christ.

True love for God compels us to gather together, give financially, and lay down our lives for the sake of the gospel. Through missions, evangelism, and serving others, churches must share the love of Christ with their community and the world. To do otherwise is directly disobeying what Jesus has commanded us to do.

Churches gather together every week to worship God. We are not here to worship our country, our accomplishments, each other, or our preference of musical style. Our only focus is on God, seeking His will and learning to glorify Him through our words and our ways.

Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.
