Luke 11:1-13 (ESV)

Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples."

²And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. ³Give us each day our daily bread, ⁴and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And lead us not into temptation."

⁵And he said to them, "Which of you who has a friend will go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves, ⁶ for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; 7and he will answer from within, 'Do not bother me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed. I cannot get up and give you anything'? 8I tell you, though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of his impudence he will rise and give him whatever he needs. 9And I tell you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.

¹¹What father among you, if his son asks for a fish, will instead of a fish give him a serpent; ¹²or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

1. This sermon first proposes that the way to learn how to pray is to pray pointedly. Most of our prayers need the form or structure we see Jesus provide. Which of these three-pointed categories challenged you most in Jesus' prayer prescription? Why?

2. Verses 5-10 teach us to P.U.S.H. Pray Until Something Happens. Here, we're told to not only shamelessly come to the Father with our requests, but we're also to "seek." In all our asking, there is a requirement of a faith that expects and goes looking for God's answers. This prevents lazy faith and praying. What does this active and persistent praying look like for you?

3. When you pray, stop modeling your prayers from religious hypocrites and start looking at a father's relationship with his child. This helps us to pray expectantly or positively. How does this passage encourage us to pray with expectation?
